I measure membership loss not by the number of empty chairs at our meetings but by the community activity we have withdrawn from in the last few years. The projects we no longer run and the service we no longer provide. That, for me, is the true measurement of membership loss.

On 16 January the District Membership, Development and Retention Committee, under the enthusiastic leadership of David Woolrich, will hold an evening at Penkridge devoted to the Membership issue and I hope that every club will be in attendance. I would also urge you to invite David to a club meeting where you can discuss the issues in more detail.
