## The District Governor's Month

A double issue this month as I report on my programme in both January and February.

As District Governor I am also a member of the Rotary in Great Britain and Ireland (RIBI) General Council, the governing body which directs the management of our organisation in these islands. Much of my time in these two months has been taken up with General Council matters as we deal with the need to have a balanced budget for the future, whilst ensuring that Rotary continues to serve our communities effectively and efficiently, and maintaining our subscription at about or below the level of Rotary subscriptions in the rest of the world.

A detailed summary of our deliberations was sent to all Clubs at the end of February – and I do urge every member to read the document and every Club to discuss the contents and ultimately vote at the RIBI Annual Business Meeting to be held on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> April.

If any Club would like me to visit and explain the difficult choices which we have had to make then I will do my best to do so.

Within the District my time in January was spent in a round of District Service Committee meetings and completing my visits to Clubs – the final two, which had to be delayed from the original planned dates due to circumstances, the visits being to Newport Lite and Willenhall. I thank both Clubs for the courtesy and hospitality – I enjoyed both meetings.

Additionally in January I attended the RC Stoke-on-Trent Youth Speaks competition, the Telford Centre Burns Night and the District International Rally. All superb events.

#### The RIBI President's visit to the District

Monday lunchtime saw us at Oak Tree Farm Rural Project, near Stafford, an organisation which provides training and supported occupation for adults with learning difficulties. Several local Clubs support the Project financially and Stafford Knot provides some mentoring to the management. We also heard about the Stafford Knot Club's programme to help disengaged children to become reconnected with the community.

Monday evening saw us at the RC Stoke-on-Trent's 90<sup>th</sup> Charter Night. It was a superb celebration of 90 years of service to their community, with their former MP Tristram Hunt as the keynote speaker. Both Eve and I were able to congratulate the Club on their achievements.

On Tuesday morning we went to Wolverhampton to see two community projects that the Wolverhampton Club established many years ago, and which continue with support from the Wolverhampton Club and several other Rotary and Inner Wheel Clubs in the area. The Multiple Sclerosis Therapy Centre celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary last September and in addition to helping sufferers from Multiple Sclerosis it now helps others who suffer from various complaints which will benefit from the treatments available. The Oxygen tank (below) was a highlight of the visit.



The visit to Compton Hospice will remain in my mind for many years to come. It was established through a steering group set up by the Wolverhampton Club and is supported by all of the Clubs in the area. The amount of financial support from Rotary is staggering – and my thanks to all of the Clubs who contribute. Eve and I were privileged to meet a patient in his room, who was clearly very ill, but he wanted to meet us and thank Rotary for all that we have done. We were both very touched, and Eve mentioned that meeting on her live facebook Q&A a few days ago

The Foundation Lunch at Linden House, the home of RC Wolverhampton was attended by so many Rotarians, who had gathered to not only celebrate the centenary of OUR Rotary Foundation, but also to witness the presentation of the Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award to PDG Fraser Dukes in recognition of his efforts over 30 plus years to raise the profile (and funds) within this District for the End Polio Now campaign. It is a very rare Award, and I can think of no better recipient. Well done Fraser.
