# Information Pack for 2017 – 2018

## District 1210 Version

### THEME – ‘A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE’

#### Introduction

The Young Photographer Competition is a well-established and successful competition promoted by Rotary International in Britain and Ireland (RIBI). The competition designed to support and encourages development of photographic skills.

The District 1210 format is simpler, so as not to conflict with our own well established successful competition. This RIBI competition will be a single stage competition aimed at all clubs and schools, some of which already take part in our own established District 1210 competition which is an entirely separate competition. It is expected that clubs themselves need not be involved to any great extent in this competition since there is an option to send school entries direct to a District receiving centre, (David Stubbs).

#### Aims

This competition aims to encourage young people to:

- Experiment with photography
- Use digital or traditional methods of photography
- Show interpretation of their chosen topic
- express their ideas through the medium of photography

#### Who can take part?

The competition is open all schools and college communities including those that are home educated and any other young people's community organisations, for example, community RotaKids, community Interact, Scout Groups, Girl Guides.

There three age groups:

Junior	7 to 10 years old
Intermediate	11 to 13 years old
Senior	14 to 17 years old

on 31 August 2017.

With the age qualifying date of 31st August 2017, it should be noted that some junior entrants may be 11, intermediate entrants may be 14 and some senior entrants may be 18 at the time of some or all the stage competitions i.e. a competitor may be 17 on 31st August but turns 18 on 1<sup>st</sup> September is allowed to enter. **Competitors must include their date of birth on the application form.**

**Schools may be invited to enter by their local Rotary club.**

## National Final

The dates for District 1210 entries into the RIBI competition will be determined locally. Interested parties should check dates with the District Coordinator David Stubbs at [holyroodstubbs@yahoo.co.uk](mailto:holyroodstubbs@yahoo.co.uk). See below

The National Final is organised by RIBI. One entry per age group by District 1210 will be submitted by **Monday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2018** to the RIBI organiser, Peter Dowse, 14 Stocksfield, Kelvedon Hatch, Brentwood, Essex. England CM15 0BU, following a selection process which will be organised by the 1210 Young Photographer Coordinator David Stubbs.

## Competition Guidelines

### Task

To produce a portfolio of three photographs based upon the theme, 'A Different Perspective' in colour or black and white on photographic paper. Prints to be submitted separately. Each print, including any mount should be no larger than A4 size. Mobile Phones may be used.

In addition, each entrant should provide a brief sentence of what each photograph represents in relation to the theme.

***No actual examples will be shown here as it will be up to the individual competitors to show their own interpretation of the chosen topic.***

For this RIBI competition, District 1210 winners will be asked for a digital copy in jpg format and ideally 5MB for an A4 sized print, on disc (CD-R) or memory stick, as part of the national final submission. ***Please ensure every photograph, disc or memory stick submitted is clearly labelled with the name of the entrant and school.***

**Please Note:** Photographs which include those of people under 18 years old must be accompanied by written permission from the parent, guardian, or carer of the person for those photographs to be submitted.

Photographs may not be returned unless specifically requested, although winner's photographs will be retained for display and discs/memory sticks returned.

## Judges for the District 1210 section of the RIBI competition

Judges will consider technical merit; content and composition; imagination and style. They will have appropriate skills, be appointed by Rotary, and will apply the judging criteria below.

## Judging Criteria

Only in exceptional circumstance, at the sole discretion of the competition organiser, will correspondence or discussions be entered into following a competition by the competition organiser.

## Prizes

At all stages of the competition, competitors will receive a certificate of participation. The national winners will be given appropriate awards.

## How to enter

Entrants need to complete the entry form at the end of this Information Pack and submit it, with their photographs, to the stage organiser at the time specified by the stage organiser as above
