## ROTARACT 50 Years On.

50 years ago, the first Rotaract club was formed to give young adults a place to connect and take action for good.

Rotaract members from each decade share what the program was like and how it shaped their lives.

The year is 1968.

A wall divides East and West Berlin, as the Cold War rages on. The U.S. and the Soviet Union are locked in a space race, and Apollo 8 becomes the first manned spacecraft to orbit the moon, sending back pictures of Earth from deep space.

And Rotary members in North Carolina, USA, charter the first Rotaract club, to provide young people opportunities for service.

A half-century has passed since those first Rotaract clubs began inspiring young leaders to take action to improve their communities. The world has changed, as has the way Rotaract members connect with one another. But the underlying values of the program, and what attracts people to it, remain remarkably the same.

### Lend With Care - Update

The lendwithcare microfinance project continues to gain momentum as more clubs join and others add to their capital lending on an annual basis. The current year will add £50000 of lending to give total cumulative lending of approx. £150000 by the end of this Rotary year having supported 2989 loans since starting this project. The benefits not only improve living standards for the entrepreneurs and their families but this effect will percolate out into their community, encourage responsibility and self determination, create employment opportunities and empower women.

Nationally lendwithcare reports an impressive default rate of just 0.2%, i.e. 203 defaults from 82900 entrepreneurs. Only 42 loans have been written off.

This is also a worthy project for youth and school groups with one of our Rotakids clubs now participating. The project provides an excellent insight into conditions in developing countries and an introduction to financial management for children as well as benefiting small businesses. There is an excellent tutor programme on the lendwithcare website for both primary and secondary age groups. Just £100 could set up a project for a youth group.

District 1210 is now the largest lender of all RIBI Rotary Districts – relative to number of clubs and membership - although District 1080 (50% bigger than D1210) has greater total lending.
