The dates of the competitions are governed by the dates of the National Finals and Easter. It is recommended that local competitions are held at least one week before District deadlines. For all competition categories, the qualifying age is as at the 31 Aug 2020.

Entry forms for all the competitors must be completed prior to the competition date. Please ensure to use the latest version of the entry forms (2021/22) and that the privacy notice is printed on the reverse of every form.

#### **Technology Tournaments**

- age categories: Foundation 11-14 years; Intermediate 15-16 years; Advanced 16+ years.
- these are one day events for multiple teams of four students to engage with Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) by collectively solving a previously unseen technology task.
- Rotary also offers Junior Technology Tournaments for younger pupils.
- each team is required to design, develop, build and then test their solution to the task.
- the tournaments develop team building, communication and time management skills.

#### **Young Artist**

- age categories: Junior 7–10 years; Intermediate 11–13 years; Senior 14–17 years.
- a theme is set for each year. 2021/22 theme: Colours of Nature.
- **Task:** to produce one two-dimensional piece of artwork based on the theme with a maximum size of A2.
- artwork can be in any medium eg pen and ink; paint; collage; or print
- each entrant must provide a brief sentence describing the relationship of the art to the theme.
- artwork that is a part of a current educational exam portfolio are not eligible for the competition due to exam board regulations.
- judges will consider: technical merit; content and composition; imagination and style.
- local competitions to be completed by the end of February.
- winning entries to be sent to the District contact by Fri 18 Feb 2022.
- the winning District entries will be sent to Rotary GB&I by Mon 28 Mar 202.

#### Young Chef

- age category: 11-17 years. Aimed at young people in middle and secondary schools.
- **Task:** to cook a three-course meal for two people for less than £20 in two hours.
- the task for local competitions may be varied eg prepare a two-course meal for £10.
- note should be taken of the safe use of knives. See the competition information pack.
- judges will consider: costing; planning; menu choice; use of knives and equipment; cooking; skills; presentation; and taste of each course.

- local competitions to be completed by the end of Jan 2022.
- names of winning entries to be sent to the District contact by Mon 8 Feb 2022.
- winners to go forward to the District Final on Wed 2 Mar 2022. Venue tbc.
- the District Winner and Runner Up will go forward to the Regional Final to be hosted by D1180. Date/venue tbc.
- there will be no National Final in 2022.

# Young Environmentalist

- age categories: Junior 7–10 years; Intermediate 11–13 years; Senior 14–17 years.
- entries can be as individuals or teams of up to four members.
- a theme is set for each year. 2021/22 theme: Climate Change / Carbon Reduction.
- **Task:** to select a topic, research and explore the magnitude of the problem, develop ideas while undertaking the project and offer solutions. Topics could include: reducing raw material use; up-cycling; recycling: fast fashion, plastics, etc.
- the project presentation method is up to entrants eg written and illustrated report; photographic or artistic presentations; audio or video reports; an app for a smartphone; interactive conversations. Any posters should be A3 or A4 in size.
- judges will consider: evidence and research; effectiveness; innovativeness; adaptability; beneficiaries; lessons learned; and presentation.
- local competitions to be completed by the end of Jan 2022.
- winning entries to be sent to the District by Fri 18 Feb 2022.
- the winning District entries will be sent to Rotary GB&I by Mon 28 Mar 2022.

## Young Filmmaker

- age categories: Junior 7–10 years; Intermediate 11–13 years; Senior 14 17 years.
- a theme is set for each year. 2021/22 theme: *Environment*.
- **Task:** To produce a five-minute film based on the theme.
- each entrant must provide a brief sentence describing the relationship to the theme.
- judges will consider: technical merit; content and composition; imagination and style.
- local competitions to be completed by the end of Jan 2022.
- winning entries to be sent to the District contact by Fri 18 Feb 2022.
- the winning District entries will be sent to Rotary GB&I by Mon 28 Mar 2022.

### Young Musician

- age category: 17 years and under. There is no lower age limit.
- **Task:** to perform a programme of music on the chosen instrument or voice for no longer than ten minutes.
- competitors must provide three copies of their selected works for the adjudicators. Those playing guitar must submit copies in staff notation not tablature.
- judges will consider: programme choice; technical ability; musicianship and interpretation; overall performance.
- local competitions to be completed by end Jan 2022.
- one instrumentalist and one singer winner can go forward to the District Final. Names to the District contact by Fri 11 Feb 2022.
- District final to be held on 5 Mar 2022. Venue tbc.
- the District Winners (one instrumentalist and one singer) will go forward to the Regional Final to be hosted by D1060. Date/venue tbc.
- there will be no National Final in 2022.

# Young Photographer

- age categories: Junior 7–10 years; Intermediate 11–13 years; Senior 14–17 years.
- a theme is set for each year. 2021/22 theme: Colours of Nature.
- Task: To produce one digital photograph based on the theme in colour or black and white.
- the photo should be in \*.jpg format and at least 1,500 pixels in size on the longest side of the photo.
- each entrant must provide a brief sentence describing the relationship of each photograph to the theme.
- judges will consider: technical merit: content and composition; imagination and style.
- local competitions to be completed by the end of Jan 2022.
- winning entries to be sent to the District contact by Fri 18 Feb 2022.
- the winning District entries will be sent to Rotary GB&I by Mon 28 Mar 2021.

### Youth Speaks: A Debate

- age categories: Intermediate 11–13 years; Senior 14–17 years.
- teams of three people: Chairperson; Proposer (speaking for the motion); and Opposer (speaking against the motion).
- **Task:** In the allocated time of 15 minutes to present a debate. The timing of each part will be monitored but it is recommended that both the Proposer and Opposer speak for 5 minutes with the Chairperson taking the remaining time for the introductions and summing up.
- judges will consider: teamwork; Chairperson delivery, manner and control of the debate; summing up and closing of proceedings; Proposer and Opposer - delivery, subject and construction of topic.
- local competitions to be completed by mid-Jan 2022. Names of the winning teams to the District contact by Mon 24 Jan 2022.
- winners to go forward to the two District Finals. Intermediate to be held on Mon 14 Feb 2022 and Senior on Wed 18 Feb 2022. Venues tbc.
- the District Winners will go forward to the Regional Final to be hosted by D1100 on Sat 26 Mar 2022. Venue tbc.
- there will be no National Final in 2022.

### **Young Writer**

- a theme is set for each year. 2021/22 theme: Environment.
- **Task:** to produce a hand-written or typed story based on the theme. Can be prose or poetry, fiction or non-fiction. The piece should be no more than 550 words for prose and a maximum of 40 lines for poetry entries. Must be submitted on A4 paper.
- judges will consider: imagination relative to the subject; ability to engage interest and be consistent in the power of argument.
- local competitions to be completed by the end of Jan 2022.
- winning entries to be sent to the District contact by Fri 18 Feb 2022.
- the winning District entries will be sent to Rotary GB&I by Mon 28 Mar 2022.

# RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award)

- age limits (for D1210): must be 16 or 17 years for the duration of the six-day course.
- course objectives: develop leadership experience and skills; gain confidence; learn the importance of competition, fitness, character and tolerance.
- clubs must interview potential participants to ensure that they understand the nature of the course.
- cost to the Club is £475 (2019. 2022 tbc). This includes all the facilities, training, food, transport and insurances. Candidates are given a recommended kit list of items to take.
- dates are Sun 21 # Fri 26 Aug 2022.

### Young Citizen Awards

- age category: under 25 year. Can be an individual or a group of young people.
- celebrates the achievements and showcases the citizenship and responsibilities demonstrated by young people.

- nominations to be sent direct to Rotary GB&I, with a copy to the District Youth Service Chair, by the end of January.
- the winners' presentations are made at the Rotary Showcase and recorded by the BBC.
- the **Young Citizen Awards** focus on young people who have made a positive difference which is recognised by the local Rotary Club. They might be champions in their school or college or the local community, young carers, fundraisers, volunteers or have shown particular courage in some way.
- the **Rotary Young Citizen Peacemaker Awards** focus on peace and conflict prevention and resolution. The Awards recognise young people who have made a significant contribution by building peace and understanding, whether in their school, local community, by for example helping tackle anti-social behavior and youth crime, perhaps as peer mentors, or with a peace project internationally. Again, nominations can be for an individual or group.
- the **Rotary Young Citizen Sporting Hero Awards** recognise and highlight the achievements and contribution of sports participants who are enabling others to participate in sport be it ablebodied or disabled for example wheelchair sport.

### Youth Exchanges

• There are three youth exchange programmes:

**LTEP – Long Term Youth Exchange Programme:** This is a school year long programme attending a local secondary school in another country.

**STEP Family to Family – Short Term Youth Exchange Programme**: A paired exchange where two 15–17 year olds experience total cultural immersion, living together in each other's home during the summer holiday.

**C&T – Camps & Tours**: Students aged between 15 and 25 join with others (one per country) for an international group experience in a 'themed' summer camp. Typically two weeks.
